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

The Annual Dzongkhag Statistics of Sarpang is the first in the series of publications. It attempts to provide comprehensive statistics of Sarpang Dzongkhag and will be published annually.

Background

Sarpang Dzongkhag is situated in the central southern foothills bordering India. The area of the Dzongkhag stretches from Phipsoo wildlife sanctuary in the west to Manas national park in the east. The Dzongkhag shares about 200 km of common border with the Indian State of Assam. It encompasses a total geographical area of 1945.5 Sq.km. Its topographical features have undulating terrain with an elevation ranging from 200 meters to 3600 meters above the mean sea level.

Sarpang Dzongkhag has one Drungkhag namely Gelephu and comprises of 12 Gewogs viz; Hille, Dekiling, Singye, Doban, Shompangkha, Gelephu, Chuzargang, Umling, Sershong, Taraythang, Jigmechoeling and Bhur. The Dzongkhag has 7,346 households and 37101 populations as per PHCB 2005.

About 12% of the total area is under agriculture. The proportion of Chuzhing and Kamzhing is almost equal. The main cereal crops are paddy, maize, wheat and millet. Cash crops such as orange, areca nut, cardamom, ginger, guava, lemon, banana and mango are also grown.

Sarpang town is one of the oldest in the country and has access to motorable roads since 1950s. Due to its close proximity to the Indian markets, Sarpang town has been the commercial hub for the central Dzongkhags.

Favorable terrain and climatic conditions combined with fertile agriculture land in the Dzongkhag provided a better opportunity for farm mechanization and horticultural development.
